Principal	Linda Ihnat	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explained the new school newsletter. Received a letter grade of 'A' this year; meeting with Dir of Assessment to review scores and categories. It's a complicated rating system. We are the only HS in PV district to get an A. She met with over 100 students to ask them about the classes they take and why. Admin is trying to raise the awareness of the importance of these merit tests. Admin is working with teachers on creating positive environments in their classrooms based on student feedback. Hallways were painted over the summer and new decals have been placed on the walls. PBIS is the discipline program at HHS. It's about focusing on positive behaviors and restorative practices. No more detention. Instead Admin sits with student and asks why it happened. (i.e., How does that show pride in school? How can you show respect? How can you be more courageous in your decisions?) It's made a difference. Learning experience for students. Takes more time on front end but Admin is seeing less repeat behavior. They give a lot of tickets for good behaviors. She thanked us (PAWS) for the gift cards Discussed the equity survey and building student relationships. Long term plan. Counselors are doing success plans. District will start having R&R weekends. We will have one in spring. Students will have no homework or tests to study for over the weekend. K-12. These weekends are designed to help kids with the pressure they face. ID policy – students need to have IDs to get services at school. They will not be punished any more if they don't wear it. Need it to use bathrooms, at dances.
