Words from Linda Ihnat

The freshman start October 8. The return to school playbook has been posted on the website. It will outline all the things that have been done.

- The floor has been lined to show the arrows to direct the kids
- The stairwells are labeled for up and down
- The distancing stickers are up in the lunch room, bathroom, bookstore
- All posters about masks are up
- All tables are labeled in the quad for every other one.
- The cafeteria has 4 chairs to a table.
- 10 new tables coming, but they are on back order
- There is a pavilion cover ordered to provide more shade
- Two lunches are scheduled
- 30 minutes between lunches to give time to clean
- Addition resources have been hired to clean rooms, handles, bathrooms, etc.
- The id are virtual on their cell phones
- Hand sanitizer in all the rooms.
- The teachers have wipes for the tables, but they don't have enough for every desk to be done before every class period
- They cannot congregate in the hall, they will have to go outside and social distance
- Students who refuse to wear masks will be sent to the office and if they still refuse, the parents will be called and they will be asked to go from in person learning to PVonline
- The kids have to wear the masks from the time they get out of the car/bus until they leave
- There are masks that are available for the students should they need one
- The doors will be open to allow air in
- Sophmores come back Monday, October 12
- Then the following week Juniors and Seniors
- The nurse is making arrangements with the kids that takes meds
- If kids get sent home they will be home for 10 days before they can come back
- If you have contact with Covid you do not come back until 14 days
- The kids are not suppose to carry medication with them
- No temp checks. Asking parents to check them at home. If **they have any symptoms** it is better to **keep them home** because if they get sent home they will be sent home longer
- If someone stays home, they can log on via PVConnect. But parents still have to call them out sick
- Students who want to switch from in person to PVConnect or visa versa, they will get one time to switch
- By the time the seniors enter 70% of the student population will be at the school

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Campus Reopening Information

Lori was on the board for reopening plans. The plans were built with parent, teacher, and administration involvement.

Overview:

- Staggered return to school
- The district protocol for masks must be a cloth multi-layered mask. No bandanas, not gators. Has to cover nose and mouth
- Masks are required on campus at all times. They can take masks breaks.
- The teachers have been told they can take their kids outside and space them out to give them a mask break.
- When they take a break they must be 6 feet away from anyone else.
- The desk spacing is being maximized as much as possible. They still have to get all the kids in the classroom. They will have assigned seats in all classrooms
- Every student needs to bring their chromebook and charger every day. There are extension cords in the classroom
- There are hand sanitizer stations through-out the school
- The district purchased masks
- We are low on wipes, paper towels, hand sanitizer, if you can please donate
- Bathrooms: the A building and C building are split in 2 sections. 1 section can use the bathroom the first 15 minutes of class, the other section the last 15 minutes of class. The restrooms are being cleaned in between each section.
- The bathrooms will be opened during lunch
- The teachers will be teaching in person and on PVConnect at the same time. They are teaching both groups of students and consider both groups just as important. They will give attention as needed
- There may be breakout rooms, this will be a combination of kids being in class and online.
- The kids will have the option to watch online while they are in class
- If you are online you must wear a mask at all times.
- Group photos are being done utilizing green screens and putting all the photos together
- If your child is sick and you have to pick them up. You must call into the office and let them know that you are there and they will send your kid out to you
- The parking passes will be done online and the kids will be notified via email
- Please be flexible everyone is trying to do the best they can. Kids are nervous and teachers are nervous. Please extend graces to all. Work together. Remember to thank all our staff and teachers they have been working so hard to make this all possible.
- If there is a child in a class that has tested positive the kids that were also in that class will be notified
- If the numbers go up into the red zone, then the school will shut down and the kids will go back to PVConnect
- We have asked for metrics to be captured and published at the school and district level

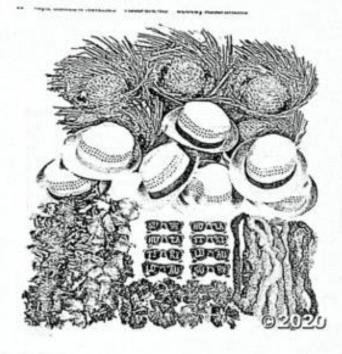

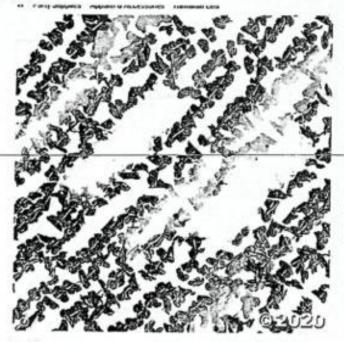

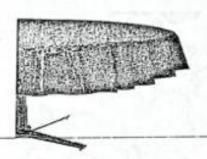
